To build a society where peace and respect as well dignity take high value in all of life cycle.

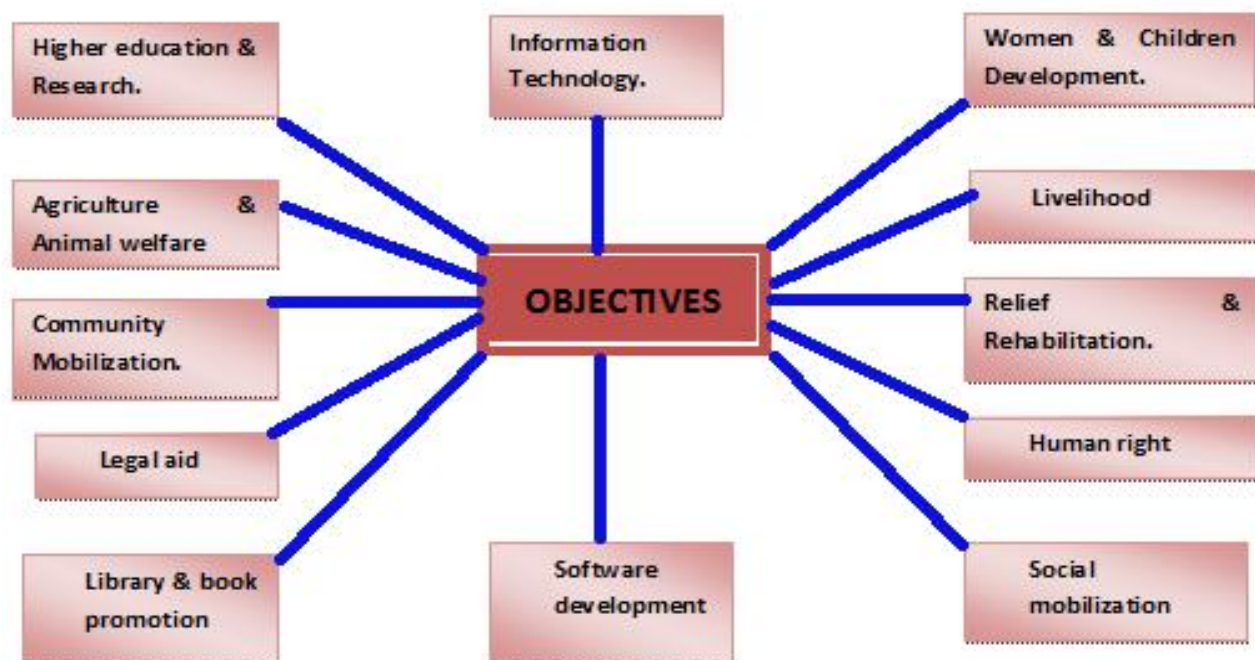

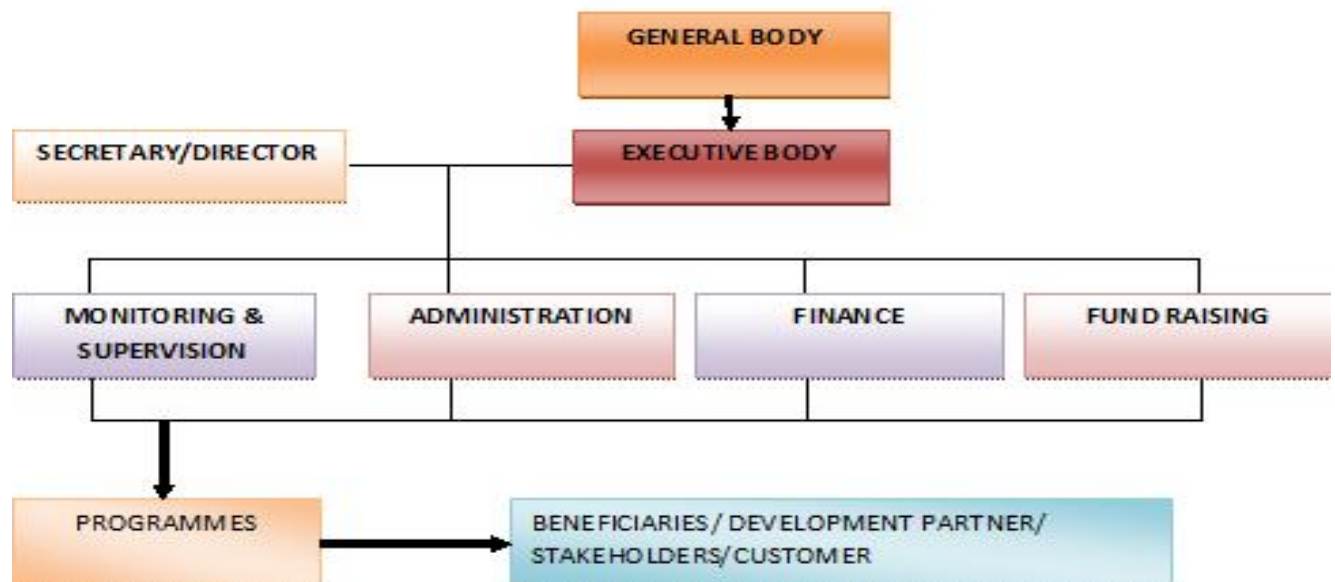

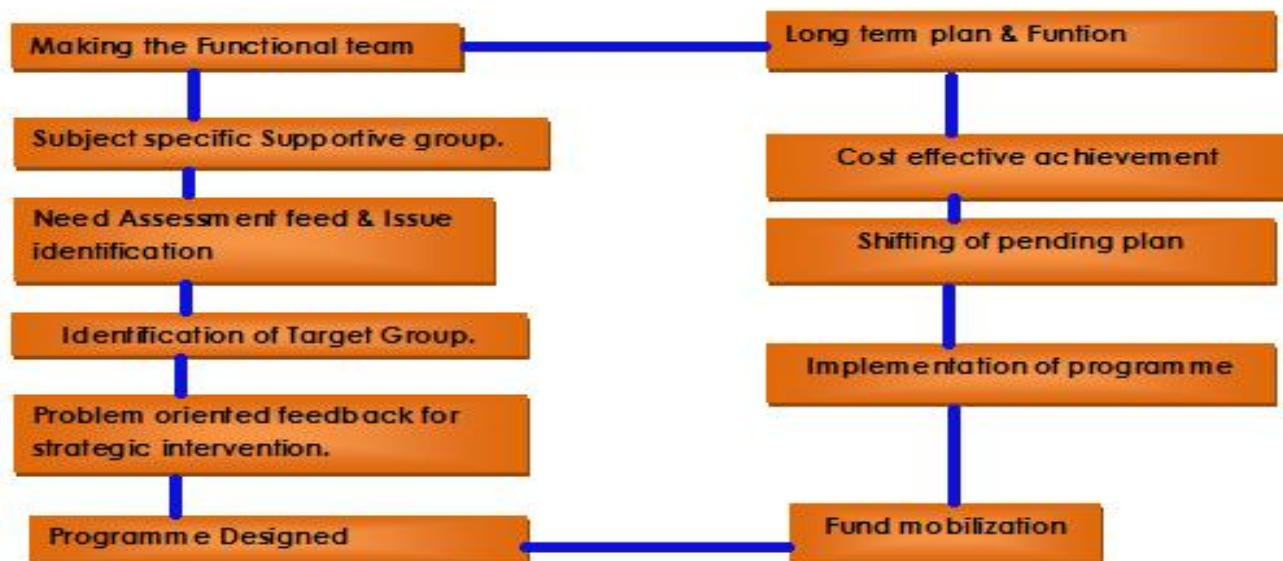

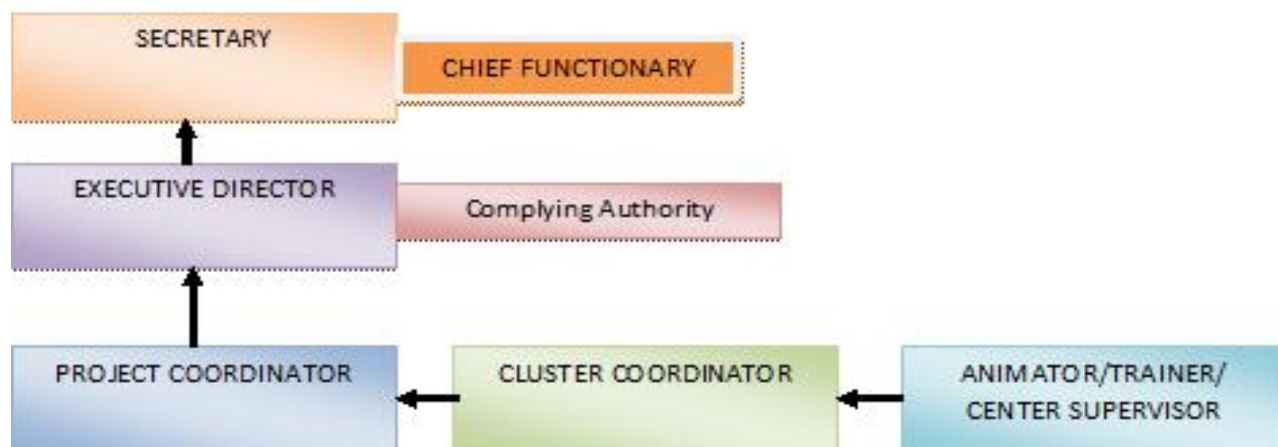
Organogram (Organization functional structure)

Operational area

Odisha is one of India's top mineral-producing states, contributing significantly to the country's output of iron ore, coal, bauxite, and chromite. Odisha accounted for 43.49% of India's total mineral production (by value), excluding fuel, atomic and minor minerals. In all cases, this share is much greater than the state's share in all-India area. The state occupies 4.74 per cent of India's landmass, 36.71 million people as per 2001 census, and accounts for 3.57 per cent of the population of the country. The quality of soil, in general, is rather low, except in the coastal districts which contain highly fertile alluvial soil and the soils of the river valleys. This is a natural weakness of the state's economy as agriculture is its mainstay. It contributes 28 per cent of the net domestic product of the state. Furthermore, 65 per cent of the total population directly or indirectly engaged in agriculture for their livelihood and occupation. As per socio-economic status of the state, it can be divided into two broad regions, i.e. the coastal region and inland districts. The former is fertile with high yielding. Even within the economy, poverty varies in its degree or levels among the regions in accordance with the levels of progress and the degree of sustaining the progress achieved. Therefore, it is not uncommon to locate poor people in India, especially state like Odisha. The poverty is multidimensional and extends beyond money income to education, health care, skills enhancement, and political participation at all levels from the local to the global. It is also determined by access to natural resources, clean water and air and advancement of one's own culture and social organization. However, alleviating poverty requires much more resources than now available to poor and developing countries. Poverty manifests itself in the form of "absolute poverty" that prevails in a state of Odisha (39.9 per cent BPL). Poverty is spatially concentrated in Odisha. Some regions such as southern Odisha are very poor, 89.14 per cent (NSS data 1990-2000). The nature and structure of the

regions and human resources engagement in developmental Programs reflects state's progress and poverty level. The unequal distributional pattern of landholdings, ownership of assets and the agricultural productivity indicate the degree of progress and the level of poverty. Odisha is not only experiencing unequal distribution of land, assets and productivity but also vulnerable to repeated natural calamities like droughts, floods, and cyclones. The recurrent visitation of natural calamities further exacerbates distress of the people, particularly small and marginal farmers and landless labourers. A disproportionately large proportion of STs and SCs population in western and southern Odisha live rather precariously with very low economic base. The poverty reduction level is not in satisfactory, even after accelerated measures taken to address their poverty, especially women and children are generally worst sufferer in these regions. In Odisha, regions like the southern and northern are not well developed as compared to the coastal region. One of the important reasons for this is the higher concentration of unfertile land and STs population. In 1983, the percentage share of ST population in the coastal region of rural Odisha was 7.2 per cent, whereas, it was as high as 39.7 per cent in the southern region and 34.5 per cent in the northern region. The poverty ratio in the coastal region was estimated at 64.0 per cent as against 85.5 and 79.1 per cent in the southern and northern regions respectively. The incidence of poverty among SC population was more or less same in all the three regions, i.e., 61-64 per cent. In case of general caste population, the incidence of poverty was comparatively much less in the coastal region than that in the southern and northern regions. Thus, in all the cases, the poverty ratio was found to be less in the coastal region. A large number of rural communities, particularly in the hilly terrains of western and southern Odisha are physically excluded for want of connectivity and other infrastructural support (i.e., markets, urban areas, and road connectivity). As a result the poor in general and STs & SCs people in particular lack access to growth centers and service centers (i.e., schools, hospitals). Rural poverty is the highest in Odisha. Rural people depend mostly on agriculture and forest resources to eke out their subsistence. However, agricultural growth has been historically generally very low. Agricultural productivity is roughly half that of the national average. Due to lack of purchasing powers of farmers, use of improved inputs (e.g., better seeds and fertilizers) is also far below the national average. Employment opportunities are rather very limited. Though extensive forest resources are important source of substance to majority of rural poor, they are highly degraded and lack desired financial and managerial inputs. Large forest areas are devoid of regeneration and therefore, cannot provide livelihood support on sustained basis unless substantial investments are made in them. Want of adequate irrigation facilities (except in certain pockets) is another limiting factor that keeps agriculture under developed. Odisha lacks high quality infrastructure (e.g., railways, paved roads, ports). Optimal exploitation of its vast natural resources demands heavy investments In infrastructural development, and the state government's capacity to develop infrastructure is very limited.

Activities Undertaken:

MBC ACTIVITIES

OBJECTIVE OF Program:

- The Program of MBC is aim to eradicate Consumer confusion regarding use of Low Transmission energy for domestic use and boost consumers to pay timely dues.
- The Program of MBC is aim to raise common understanding among consumer community on rational use of LT energy for domestic use.
- The Program of MBC is aim to prepare next generation for the appropriate behavior towards rational use of electricity.
- The Program of MBC is aim to give scope for consumers of remote area to take appropriate treatment to retain their physical fitness.
- The Program of MBC is aim to promote Women's empowerment and it can be defined to promoting women's sense of self-worth, their ability to determine their own choices, and their right to influence social change for themselves and others.

- The Program is a life changing scope for women to raise their income and exposure in their society which give mileage to gain self respect and social importance in their family and society.

Executive Summary: The proposed project aims at emphasizing capacity building of women to improve the livelihood of the marginalized communities through MBC activities. To improve the performance of usage of electricity & control the theft of electricity through rigorous monitoring. This program will be implemented by the expert volunteers with realistic approach aiming at the MBC activities. The proposed project would be implemented in ANGUL and TALCHER division in phased manner.

Activities Under The Program:

Selection of WSHGs

The Program is implemented in Anugul and Talcher Electrical Divisions and the leaders from WSHGs available in the areas as per their locations under the Gram Panchayats are called for common meeting. Where the Groups are recognized their rank through the valuation of their activities such as Savings, thrift and other extraordinary activities in their respective location.

Capacity Building:

The selected WSHs members are called in a series effort of training how they shall read the LT energy domestic supply meter reading; handle the bill generation process through machine. In addition they are trained to collect dues from consumers and process of generation of amount receipt.



Revenue generation:

The selected WSHGs are motivated to collect monthly dues, arrears dues and other charges from the consumers of Anugul and Talcher electrical divisions under TPCODL(Tata Power Central Odisha Distribution Limited). In this connection 42.81 core Amounts have been collected from ANED & TED Divisions.





Consumer Awareness on rational use of LT energy and Safety:

The consumers of LT energy users are motivated for the conservation and safe handle of electrical instrument through this awareness campaign. The participants are also motivated through various awareness actions to know the safety measure while using the electricity at domestic level. In addition the participants are aware of the rational use of energy for future

Conservation.



Abha Shakti Rewards & Recognition Program-

In this context of Program the Top performer in collection, regularity and participation from WSHGs are identified and they are awarded with recognition and that aim to create learning for other performers and one of the encouragements to others.

- ❖ All SHGs should be collect Arrear bill during billing period & before billing.
- ❖ Discussed about how to improve their MR coverage & Revenue collection & meet their target.
- ❖ How to convince consumers to give 100% of current amount, Even if extra arrear is showing.
- ❖ Discussed about how to coverage 95% MR on billing.
- ❖ Collection app & Bill parameters trainings are provided to SHGs by our staffs.
- ❖ Vehicle & Ladder will move continously for disconnection drive.
- ❖ SHGs Collect all application or form of consumers for bill revision or bill dispute.
- ❖ All SHGs Share their MR & Amount daily.
- ❖ All SHGs should be collect bill amount of non paying consumer after closing
- ❖ All SHGs should be maintain register of all consumers.
- ❖ All SHGs Should be Submit their invoice slip before 5th day of the month.
- ❖ All SHGs Should be Submit the nonpaying consumers remarks in Section office every month.

- ❖ Discussed about regularization of unauthorized to authorized consumers.
- ❖ All the SHG share the ghost consumer, DC list, Online payment list, Not found consumer list in every week.
- ❖ Suggested to SHGs to involved in Safety & Consumers Awareness Program, Club energy, MHU Camp, Gaon Chala Camp & Other CSR Activities.

Challenges:

- ❖ Most of the Lower caste backward villagers are not paying electricity bill due to they have no income source.
- ❖ Most of the consumers are not availing their houses due to seasonal farming so they are not available in day time, so MR coverage & Collection Amount has been hampered.
- ❖ During Arrear drive collection create consumer hesitation & affray due to dispute off bill.
- ❖ Extra Arrear and extra amount has been added in bill so that the consumers disagree to pay bill.
- ❖ SHGs touches almost consumers house multiple times but the consumers are disagree to pay bill due to extra arrear.
- ❖ The meter readers were not billing properly or completely from one side of the village so SHGs face problems during collection.
- ❖ Where the meter reader was billing they left some consumers houses so that collection has hampered.
- ❖ Previous month collected amount and rebate amount were not debited from the current bill and some extra charges included in some bills so arising consumer hesitation in field.
- ❖ In MHU Camp the MHU Team has been reached late in villages due to long distance, so we facing Patient hesitation.
- ❖ Patients are not Satisfy with MHU Camp because we distribute medicines only those patients who has paid last month electricity bill.
- ❖ During Consumer Safety & Awareness the villagers wants some snacks or cold drinks which we couldn't able to give.
- ❖ For Club energy Programs some schools are not allowing us to do the programs & some schools are not giving sufficient times to over the programs.
- ❖ In Club energy the Students wants Snacks or Chocolates.

Achievements:

- ❖ 988146 no of MR have been collected in ANED & TED Divisions.
- ❖ 42.81 core Amounts have been collected from ANED & TED Divisions.

- ❖ 98 Safety & Consumers awareness programs are held by our staffs in ANED & TED Division in which more than 1685 consumers benefited.
- ❖ Our staffs mobilized consumers about how to consume electricity wisely.
- ❖ We explained consumers about Electricity Conservation, save energy, Road safety and Tree plantation.
- ❖ There are two Reward and Recognition programs were successfully conducted in Angul & Talcher Divisions.
- ❖ SHGs MBC Training programs were conducted successfully.
- ❖ More than 300 consumes have been regularized in ANED & TED Division.
- ❖ More than 1100 consumers have been benefited through bill revision in ANED & TED.
- ❖ 125 ghost consumers were found in ANED & TED electrical divisions.
- ❖ Around 5500 habitual non-paying consumers have been converted to paying consumers from arrears standpoint in some GPs.
- ❖ 6430 Consumers issues are reported & we successfully resolved 6395 consumer's issues.
- ❖ Around 3710 Bill dispute cases were resolved in ANED & TED Division.
- ❖ In these TVW programs we discuss about Road Safety, Waters Day, Electrical safety, Health awareness and others awareness program.

Objective of Programme

To enhance livelihood opportunities and improve the socio-economic conditions of rural and tribal communities in Chadheipahadi GP by providing skill-based vocational training in tailoring, basic computer operation, Sal leaf plate making and sustainable agriculture.

Theme of programme-

This Program is a unique initiative envisioned by the CAAD and TPNODL of Odisha to empower rural youths, women, adolescent girls and farmers . As part of its Corporate Social Responsibility (CSR), TPNODL, under the able leadership of the CSR Head, Mr. Dillip Sahoo, initiated a community empowerment program in Chadheipahadi GP of Bijatola Block in Mayurbhanj District to provide livelihood-oriented skill training for rural youth and women. The project focused on three key vocational areas: Tailoring, Basic Computer Training, and Sal Leaf Plate Making — chosen based on local resource availability, community needs, and market potential. Training for farmers were conducted for a sustainable allied agriculture.

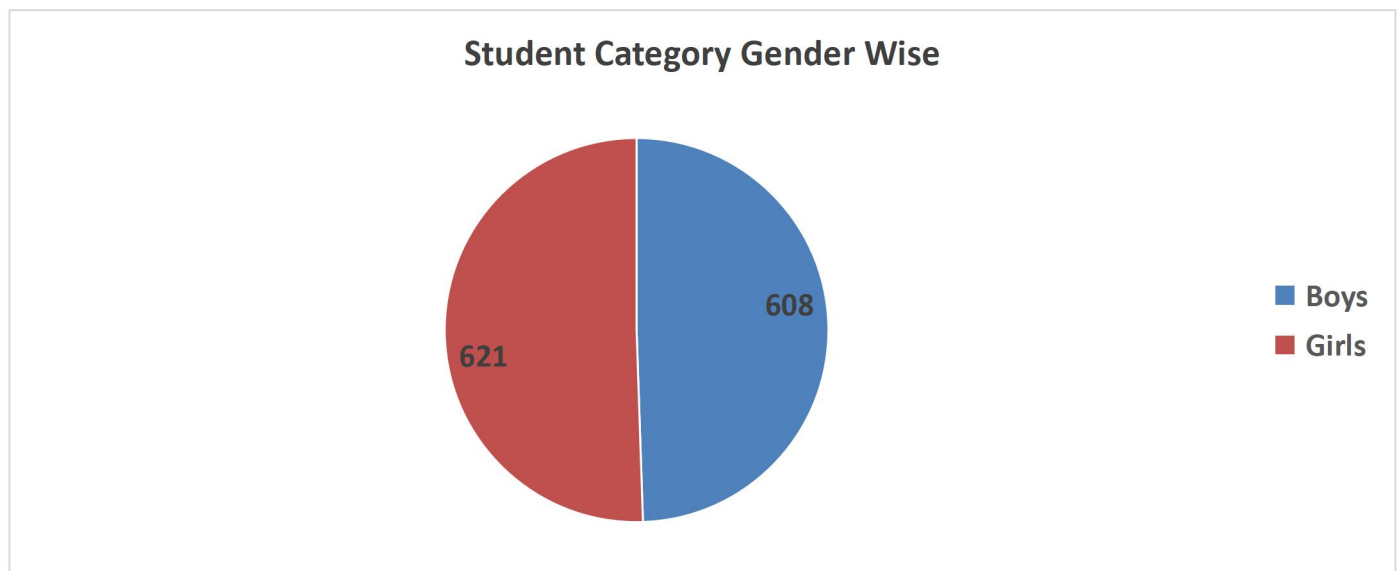

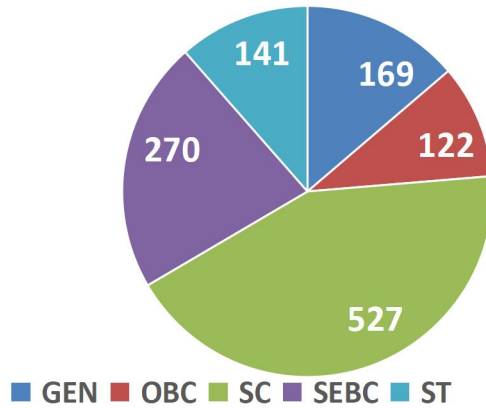

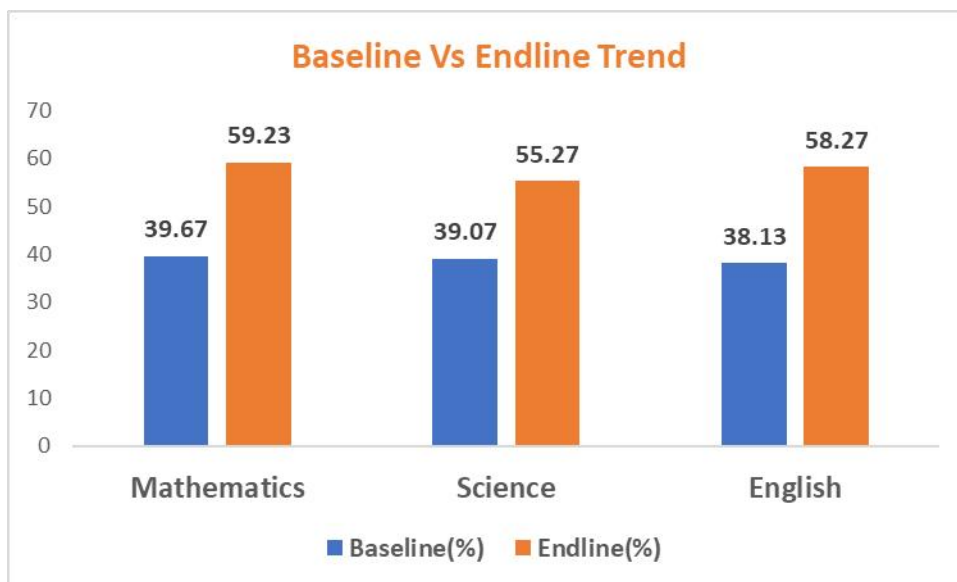
Caste Wise Students Count

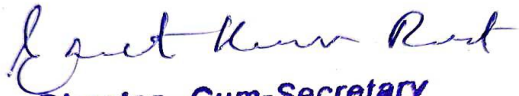

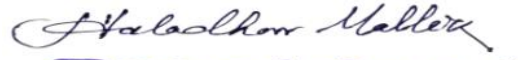
